Description:

Ciudad SWCD would like to establish a Price Agreement to procure construction services for building an ADA trail at the Tijeras Bio-Zone Education Center, a City of Albuquerque Open Space Division property. Ciudad SWCD is seeking services from a qualified landscape vendor to construct a multi-sensory universal designed trail, that also includes graduated challenges to allow individuals to push their limits to meet their goals. The terms and conditions of this Price Agreement shall form a part of each other issued hereunder.

Term:

Ciudad SWCD has been awarded grant funding from the New Mexico Economic Development Department to construct the ADA Sensory Trail and the grant terminates on June 30th, 2025. The term of this Price Agreement shall be for 6months (12) months from the date of award with option to extend for a period(s) of six (6) months, by mutual agreement of all parties and approval of the at the same price, terms, and conditions. This price agreement shall not exceed one (1) year.

Available Budget:

Ciudad SWCD has grant funding in the amount of \$402,639.10 in order to construct this trail. Bids that exceed this amount, including applicable gross receipts tax will not be accepted.

Services:

The Awarded Vendor will be contacted on an as needed, on-call basis to perform work associated with this Price Agreement. A Price Agreement award is without assurance of dollar amount of work: Ciudad SWCD does not guarantee any amount of work. Failure to respond to the Ciudad SWCD's requests may be grounds for termination of this Price Agreement.

Escalation/Reduction Clause:

In the event of a pricing increase, the Awarded Vendor shall submit request directly, providing substantiating evidence that each request is based on demonstrable market changes impacting the cost of services, to Ciudad SWCD for review. Ciudad SWCD may adjust pricing no more than once annually through an amendment to the Agreement at the time of Agreement renewal. The request must show all proposed increases by line item and include supporting documentation. Ciudad SWCD's decision on what is acceptable in this context is final and shall be accepted by all parties to the Agreement. *Requested price increases that exceed 10% will not be accepted*. Pricing changes will apply to Agreements and amendments to Agreements entered on and after the effective date of the price change. Price decreases as well as increases shall apply in the same manner. If vendor's prices are reduced for any reason, Ciudad SWCD shall receive the benefit of such reductions, immediately. Price increases will not be retroactive to orders already in house or backorders. Orders will be filled at the price in effect on the date of receipt of the order by the vendor.

NOTE TO BIDDERS:

All bids must be made completely independent of all other bids submitted. Where multiple bids are submitted by bidding entities owned by the same person or persons, those bids will be presumed to not be made independently of one another and may be disqualified.

CIUDAD SWCD SPECIAL PROVISIONS

1. **REQUESTS FOR PAYMENT**

Payment for amounts due shall be paid within thirty (30) days after Ciudad SWCD receives an undisputed request for payment. Payment by Ciudad SWCD to the Contractor may be made by first-class mailing, or by hand delivery of the undisputed amount of a pay request based on work completed or service provided under the contract.

The Contractors and all Subcontractors shall make prompt payment to their Subcontractors and Suppliers for amounts owed for work performed on the construction project within seven days after receipt of payment from the Ciudad SWCD, Contractor or Subcontractor.

2. PROJECT SITE

The site improvement work to be accomplished under this Contract is located at 156000 Central Avenue SE, Albuquerque, NM 87123.

3. TIME FOR COMPLETION AND LIQUIDATED DAMAGES

The work which the Contractor is required to perform under this Contract shall begin at the time stipulated by Ciudad SWCD in the Notice to Proceed to the Contractor and shall be completed within 90 calendar days from the date of the Notice to Proceed or before June 30th, 2024, whichever comes first. Should and extension be requested, Ciudad SWCD may consider an amendment.

Liquidated damages, at the rate of \$250.00 per day, shall be assessed against the Contractor for each calendar day or portion thereof that work remains incomplete after expiration of the time specified in the Notice to Proceed or any approved written extensions of time.

For liquidated damages purposes, Project time will cease to accrue upon issuance by Ciudad SWCD of a Notice of Substantial Completion. Once the Project is substantially complete, Ciudad SWCD will issue a Notice of Substantial Completion which shall contain a punch list of minor items that remain to be completed and the number of days in which the contractor shall complete the items listed in the punch list to the satisfaction of Ciudad SWCD. Failure to complete all punch list items within the time specified in the Notice of Substantial Completion shall result in the assessment of liquidated damages at the rate specified herein above until all punch list items are completed in addition to any other liquidated damage assessment for failure to complete the work within the time designated in the Notice to Proceed or any written extensions.

The sum of the liquidated damages will be deducted from any monies due the Contractor. If no money is due the Contractor, said sum may be recovered by Ciudad SWCD from the Contractor or their surety, or from both combined. These deductions are to cover liquidated damages to Ciudad SWCD for additional expenses of supervision, overhead, and other costs resulting from failure of the Contractor to complete the work within the designated time and are not to be considered as penalties. Except as otherwise set forth herein, Ciudad SWCD shall not be considered liable for any extra or additional payment to the Contractor as a bonus or premium for early completion.

4. COMMUNICATIONS

- A. All notices, demands, requests, instructions, changes to the Contract, approvals, proposals and claims shall be in writing.
- B. Any notice to, or demand upon the Contractor, shall be sufficiently given if delivered at the office of the Contractor as stated in the Bid (or at such other

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office as the Contractor may, from time to time designate in writing to Ciudad SWCD) or if deposited in the United States mail in a sealed, postage-prepaid envelope, or delivered with charges prepaid to any telegraph company for transmission to such office.

C. All papers required to be delivered to Ciudad SWCD, unless otherwise specified in writing to the Contractor, shall be delivered to:

and any notice to, or demand upon Ciudad SWCD shall be sufficiently given if so delivered, or if deposited in the United States mail in a sealed postageprepaid envelope or delivered with charges prepaid to any telegraph company for transmission to Ciudad SWCD at such address, or to such other address or representative as Ciudad SWCD may subsequently specify in writing to the Contractor for such purpose.

D. Any such notice shall be deemed to have been given as of the time of actual delivery or, in the case of mailing, when the same should have been received in due course of post, or in the case of telegrams at the time of actual receipt, as the case may be.

5. COORDINATION OF SPECIFICATIONS AND CONTRACT DOCUMENTS

These Plans, Specifications, Contract Documents, and all Addenda to the Specifications and Documents, if any, are essential parts of the Contract, and a requirement occurring in one is just as binding as though occurring in all. They are intended to be complementary, to describe and provide for a complete work. In case of a discrepancy, figured dimensions, unless obviously incorrect, shall govern over scaled dimensions.

The Contractor shall not take advantage of any apparent error or omission in the Plans and Specifications. In the event the Contractor discovers an apparent error or discrepancy, the Contractor shall immediately call upon Ciudad SWCD for its interpretation and decision, and such decision shall be final.

6. JOB OFFICES

- A. The Contractor and their Subcontractors may maintain such office and storage facilities as are necessary for the proper conduct of work. Arrangement for and cost associated with such facilities are the responsibility of the Contractor. Ciudad SWCD shall be consulted and approve the location(s) of such facilities.
- B. Upon completion of the work, or as directed by Ciudad SWCD, the Contractor shall remove all such temporary structures and facilities from the site(s), the same to become their property, and leave the work site(s) in good condition, or as otherwise required by the Contract.
- 7. **TERMINATION**

This Agreement may be terminated by Ciudad SWCD for its convenience upon fifteen (15) days prior written notice to the Contractor.

8. EMERGENCY PROVISIONS

The Contractor must designate at least one (1) capable, responsible employee to represent itself in case of an emergency. Such employee(s) shall have a local telephone where they may be reached at any hour of the day or night. Directions for contacting such employee(s) shall be given to the Project Manager for Ciudad SWCD Project Manager, applicable City of Albuquerque Open Space Department, Ciudad SWCD Sheriff's Office or other emergency personnel.

9. ACCESS TO SITE

The Contractor will allow access to the construction site(s), afford all facilities for observation of the work as it progresses, and provide for the on-site safety of authorized personnel of the following:

- A. Ciudad SWCD and its Agents.
- B. City of Albuquerque and its Agents.
- C. PNM

10. SOURCE AND PURCHASE OF MATERIALS, EQUIPMENT, AND SUPPLIES

- A. As part of this Contract, and as one of the considerations for the awarding of the same, the Contractor agrees that they will not, in the performance of this Contract, knowingly do business with or purchase or obtain materials, equipment, supplies, or services of any kind or character, either directly or indirectly, from any employee of Ciudad SWCD.
- B. The Contractor further agrees that, in the event of a violation of any of the provisions of the preceding paragraph, this Contract may be canceled by Ciudad SWCD, and in such an event, the Contractor waives and relinquishes any right or claim which they may have or claim to have for damages, current or future payments or otherwise by reason of such cancellation.

11. WATER AND UTILITIES

The Contractor, at their expense, shall provide and make arrangements for water and other utilities required. The Contractor shall be responsible for the coordination of all utilities.

12. CONSTRUCTION SITE SAFETY

Ciudad SWCD is not responsible for Construction Site Safety Engineering. The Contractor is responsible for all Construction Site Safety Engineering. Construction Site Safety Engineering as used herein includes, but is not limited to, design and review of site safety precautions which are utilized to protect the workmen, the general public, and others from bodily injury or property damage. This includes, but is not limited to, scaffolding, trench shoring, and concrete form work and the structural adequacy of the same.

Traffic control devices such as detours, barricades, warning lights, and signs of the proper type and location; the use of flagmen; and all other methods and means of maintaining a safe place to work shall be the responsibility of the Contractor and shall be in accordance with the most current edition of <u>Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices</u> of the U.S. Department of Transportation, Federal Highway Administration. The Contractor shall develop a Project Safety Engineering Plan and submit to the Ciudad SWCD prior to initiation of construction activities. Associated costs shall be considered incidental and included in the appropriate bid items.

All Contractors and their Subcontractors shall comply with OSHA 29 CFR 1926, Safety and Health Regulations for Construction. A detailed Safety and Health Plan shall be prepared by the Contractor as part of a Project Safety Engineering Plan and shall be provided to the Project Manager before the Notice to Proceed is issued. The Contractor shall make available upon request all OSHA required documentation, including but not limited to, Job Hazard Analysis, Safety and Health Plan updates, Material Safety Data Sheets, listing of Material Safety Data Sheets, environmental monitoring data, evidence of training, and confined space entry permits.

13. MANUFACTURER'S WARRANTIES

Ciudad SWCD and the Contractor(s) shall exhaust all manufacturer's warranties, prior to filing of claims against any other party, for the failure of such manufactured products to function properly.

14. **RECORDING WORK**

The Contractor shall keep one record copy of all Plans, Specifications, Drawings, Addenda, Modifications, and Shop Drawings at the site in good order and annotated to show all changes made during the construction process current to within two weeks. These shall be available to the Project Manager at all times.

15. CHANGES IN THE WORK - CHANGE ORDERS

The combined allowance for overhead and profit, included in the total cost to Ciudad SWCD, shall be based on the following procedure: With each proposal for a change in the amount of the Contract, the Contractor shall submit an itemized breakdown of all increases or decreases in the cost of the Contractor's and all Subcontractor's work to include at least the following detail in the general order listed:

- Material quantities and unit costs
- Labor amounts and hourly rates (identified with specific items of materials to be placed or operation to be performed)
- Equipment cost, if any
- Worker's Compensation and Public Liability Insurance Overhead and Profit
- Employment Taxes under FICA and FUTA
- The allowance for overhead and profit combined shall be based on the following schedule:
- Subtotal before Applying the Percentage Shown

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- Contractor for work performed by their own forces 10
- Subcontractor for work performed by their own forces 10
- Contractor for work performed by their Subcontractors 5

On proposals covering both increases and decreases in the amount of the Contract, the combined overhead and profit shall be allowed on the net increase only.

16. BOARD OF CIUDAD SUPERVISORS

No officer or employee of the Ciudad SWCD or public officer of the State shall be admitted to any share or part of this Contract or to any benefit that may rise therefrom, directly or indirectly, unless it be made with a corporation for its general benefit.

17. CONTRACTOR'S INDEMNIFICATION

The Contractor hereby agrees to hold harmless and indemnify the Ciudad SWCD, its officers, agents, and employees from and against all liability, claims, damages, losses or expenses, including attorney's fees, arising out of or resulting from the Contractor's and/or any of their sub- contractor's employees', agents', or officers' conduct, performance, act(s), effort(s), or omission(s) relating in any manner whatsoever to this Agreement. This indemnification provision is subject to the limitations and provisions of Section 56-7-1, N.M.S.A 1978.

Receipt by the Ciudad SWCD of the Contractor's services under this Agreement, review by the Ciudad SWCD of any Plans, Specifications and documents by the Contractor, and Ciudad SWCD authorizations for the Contractor to proceed with the various phases of services shall not be construed as approval of the Contractor's work product by the Ciudad SWCD or as the giving of instruction or directions by the Ciudad SWCD.

The indemnity required hereunder shall not be limited by reason of the specifications of any particular insurance coverage in this Agreement.

18. CONTRACTOR'S DUTY

The Contractor has the affirmative duty to discover any defects, errors or omissions in the Plans, Specifications, Change Orders, and/or in the actual construction of the Project, and upon discovery, to immediately report them to Ciudad SWCD and to take any and all action necessary to mitigate and/or eliminate their effect on the Project and the cost thereof to the maximum extent possible.

If the Contractor discovers or should have discovered an error, omission or discrepancy in the Plans, Specifications, Change Orders, and/or in the actual construction of the Project and fails to notify the Project Manager of such, then the Contractor shall assume all incidental and consequential liability therefor, shall not be compensated therefor, and shall indemnify and hold harmless Ciudad SWCD therefor.

19. CONSTRUCTION SURVEYING AND STAKING

Construction surveying and staking shall be performed by the Contractor unless provided for by others. The associated costs shall be considered incidental and included in the costs under the applicable bid item(s), unless there is a specific bid item for construction staking.

20. INSURANCE AND BONDING REQUIREMENTS

The minimum requirements for bonding and insurance requirements shall be as follows:

- a. A bid guarantee from each Bidder equivalent to five percent of the bid price. The "bid guarantee" shall consist of a firm commitment such as an original bid security, or other negotiable instrument acceptable to Ciudad SWCD accompanying a Bid as assurance that the Bidder will, upon acceptance of this Bid, execute such contractual documents as may be required within the time specified.
- b. A performance bond on the part of the contractor for 100 percent of the Contract price. A "performance bond" is one executed in connection with a Contract to secure fulfillment of all the Contractor's obligations under such Contract.
- c. A payment bond on the part of the contractor for 100 percent of the Contract price. A "payment bond" is one executed in connection with a contract to assure payment as required by law of all persons supplying labor and material in the execution of the work provided for in the Contract.
- d. Certificate of Insurance will be required in the terms, conditions and amounts as stated in these specifications.

21. CONTRACTORS PUBLIC LIABILITY INSURNCE

The Contractor shall procure and maintain at the Contractor's expense, insurance of the kinds and in the amounts herein provided. This insurance shall be provided by insurance companies authorized to do business in the State of New Mexico and shall cover all operations under the Contract, whether performed by the Contractor, the Contractor's agents or employees, or by Subcontractors. All insurance provided shall remain in full force and effect for the entire period of the work, up to and including final acceptance, and the removal of all equipment and employees, agents and Subcontractors therefrom.

If part of the Contract with the Ciudad SWCD is sublet or subcontracted, the vendor shall require the Subcontractor to secure insurance to protect itself against all hazards enumerated herein, which are not covered by the vendor's insurance policies and to include Ciudad SWCD as an additional insured thereon.

The Contractor shall procure and maintain, during the life of this Contract, Workers Compensation, Commercial General Liability, and Business Automobile Liability Insurance policies. The policies will be written with Ciudad SWCD as additional insured, while acting

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within the scope of their duties against all claims arising out of, or in connection with, the work to be performed.

Ciudad SWCD shall be an additional insured (Form $B - CG2010 \ 10/01$ or on equivalent form) and will be written on an occurrence form, and shall provide limits as follows:

A. (1) Workers Compensation-Statutory(2) Employers Liability-\$1,000,000

Contractor shall comply with the provisions of the Workers Compensation Act of the State of New Mexico, (the "Act"). If the Contractor has determined that it is not subject to the Act, it will certify, in a signed statement, that it is not subject to the Act. The Contractor will notify Ciudad SWCD and comply with the Act should it employ three or more persons during the term of any Agreement with the County. If the Contractor fails to comply with the Workers Compensation Act and applicable rules when required to do so, agreement with Ciudad SWCD may be terminated effective immediately.

B. Commercial General Liability with ISO CG0001 07/98
(1) Bodily Injury/Property Damage: \$1,000,000 Each Occurrence \$2,000,000 General Aggregate

> (2) Products/Completed Operations: \$1,000,000 Each Occurrence \$2,000,000 Aggregate

- (3) Property Damage Liability Insurance shall not exclude (XCU)
- (4) Pollution Legal Liability-\$1,000,000 Each Occurrence

C. Business Automobile Liability

(1) Combined Single Limit-\$1,000,000 Each Occurrence with ISO CA0001 10/01

Business Automobile Liability Insurance shall include coverage for the use of all owned, non-owned and hired automobiles and vehicles.

D. Independent Contractor: Included

E. Contractual Liability: Included

The Contractor shall furnish one copy each of Certificates of Insurance herein required for each copy of the Agreement, which shall specifically set forth evidence of all coverage required. If such limits are higher than the minimum limits required by Ciudad SWCD, such limits shall be certified and shall apply to the coverage afforded Ciudad SWCD under the terms and conditions of the contract as though required and set forth in the Contract. The Contractor shall furnish to the Ciudad SWCD copies of any endorsements that are subsequently issued amending coverage or limits.

Approval of Insurance

Even though a "Notice to Proceed" may have been given by Ciudad SWCD, the Contractor or Subcontractor(s) shall not begin work under this Contract, or solicitation, until the required insurance has been obtained and the proper Certificates of Insurance (or insurance policies) have been filed with Ciudad SWCD, adding Ciudad SWCD as an additional insured as applicable. Neither approval nor failure to approve certificates, policies or insurance by Ciudad SWCD shall relieve the Contractor or Subcontractor(s) of full responsibility to maintain the required insurance in full force and effect.

22. OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS

Ciudad SWCD is the sole owner of all documents, reports, and data, compiled or arising out of the Contract and/or Project regardless of the medium used.

23. GUARANTEE PROVISIONS

After the approval of final payment and prior to the expiration of one (1) year after the date of substantial completion of this Contract or such longer period of time as may be prescribed by law or by the terms of any applicable special guarantee required by the Contract Documents, if any work is found to be defective, Contractor shall promptly, without costs to Ciudad SWCD and in accordance with Ciudad SWCD's written instruction, either correct such defective work or, if it has been rejected by Ciudad SWCD, remove it from the site, and replace it with non-defective work. The Contractor shall also reimburse Ciudad SWCD for the cost of any reasonable testing or exploratory work conducted to verify the limits and amounts of the defective work. If the Contractor fails to promptly comply with the terms of such instructions, Ciudad SWCD may have the defective work corrected or the rejected work removed and replaced and all direct and indirect costs of such removal and replacement, including compensation for additional professional services, shall be paid by the Contractor.

24. PROJECT CONSTRUCTION SIGNS

- A. GENERAL: The Contractor shall provide, erect, and maintain for the duration of the construction Project, Project construction signs as shown in Section 11 Drawings, at all locations shown on the construction plans. At Ciudad SWCD's discretion, the signs may be provided by Ciudad SWCD and may be installed subsequent to the award of the Contract, but not less than seven (7) days prior to the expected start of construction.
- B. CONSTRUCTION SCHEDULE SIGNS: The Contractor shall provide the Ciudad SWCD with a Construction Schedule for signs, which must first be approved by the Ciudad SWCD. Once approved, the Contractor shall comply with the dates and times specified in the Construction Schedule for signs.
- C. MAINTENANCE INCIDENTAL: Maintenance of said signs shall be incidental to the project and no separate payment shall be made therefor.
- 25. CULTURAL RÉSOURCES

If the Contractor discovers human remains or other archaeological evidence during Project excavation, they shall cease work in the area, and notify the Project Manager, who will then notify the New Mexico State Historic Preservation Officer.

26. PROJECT SEQUENCING BY CONTRACTING AGENCY

Ciudad SWCD reserves the right to direct the Contractor to schedule certain parts of the project for completion before others. If so directed, the Contractor shall construct that portion of the project when directed by the Project Manager. <u>PARTIAL ACCEPTANCE</u>

Partial acceptance of completed portions of the project is permitted and encouraged. When a portion of the Project is complete, tested, and ready to be able to provide service, the Contractor may request acceptance of that portion of the Project.

27. WEEKLY CONSTRUCTION MEETINGS

The Contractor shall conduct weekly meetings during the duration of the project with Ciudad. Meeting topics are to include the construction schedule status, submittal status, required design/construction clarifications, issues with the public, and potential problems or concerns. Failure to update the construction schedule and present the updated schedule at the next weekly meeting shall result in the immediate imposition of additional liquidated damages in the amount of \$250.00 per day for each day the construction schedule is not updated and delivered to the Ciudad SWCD in addition to any other damages and/or liquidated damages which may be imposed pursuant to the terms of this Construction Contract Bid Specifications.

28. WORKING HOURS

The Contractor shall limit his operations to a normal $8\frac{1}{2}$ hour workday Monday through Friday. The normal $8\frac{1}{2}$ hour workday shall be considered to be from 7:30 am to 4:00 pm with a $\frac{1}{2}$ hour lunch period during which the Contractor's operations may continue. The Contractor may submit a written request for alternate working hours, however, under no circumstances shall a normal work week exceed $42\frac{1}{2}$ hours (including lunch periods).

Written requests for alternate working hours shall be submitted to the Project Manager for approval no later than the date of the Preconstruction Meeting. Alternate working hours shall be approved for the entire duration of the contract, with the exception of emergency conditions.

29. DUST ABATEMENT

Contractor will be required to follow the regulations as defined in 20 NMAC 11-20 <u>Airborne</u> <u>Particulate Matter</u> for dust control requirements in Ciudad SWCD. The Contractor shall obtain the Fugitive Dust Control Construction Permit from the City of Albuquerque, Environmental Health Department, Air Pollution Control Division. This shall be considered incidental to the completion of the project and therefore no separate measurement or payment will be made. If any threatened or endangered species or their habitats are discovered during construction, work will cease immediately, and the EPA will be notified in order that appropriate measures can be taken in accordance with the Endangered Species Act.

31. DISPOSAL OF CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS

Construction material and waste products, including machinery leaking, maintenance materials and spills, will be contained and properly disposed prior to project completion.

32. WEATHER DELAYS

If adverse weather conditions are the basis for a request for additional time, such request shall be documented by data substantiating that weather conditions were abnormal for the period of time, could not have been reasonably anticipated, and had an adverse effect on the scheduled construction.

Terms and Conditions of the Invitation to Bid

(Unless otherwise specified)

1. Notice of Penalties

The Procurement Code, 13-1-28 through 13-1-199 NMSA 1978, imposes civil, misdemeanor and felony criminal penalties for its violation. In addition, the New Mexico criminal statutes impose felony penalties for bribes, gratuities and kick-backs.

2. Notice of Termination

The ITB may be canceled and that any and all proposals may be rejected in whole or in part when it is in the best interest of Ciudad SWCD.

3. Notice of No Obligation

This ITB in no manner obligates Ciudad SWCD to the use of any Bidder's services until a valid written contract is awarded and approved by appropriate authorities.

4. Governing Law

This ITB and any agreement with a Bidder which may result from this procurement shall be governed by the laws of the State of New Mexico.

5. Legal Review

Ciudad SWCD requires that all Bidders agree to be bound by the General Requirements contained in this ITB. Any Bidder's concerns must be promptly submitted in writing to the attention of the Chief Procurement Manager.

6. Protest Period

7. Basis for Bid

Only information supplied in writing by the Chief Procurement Officer or contained in this ITB shall be used as the basis for the preparation of Offeror proposals.

8. Sufficient Appropriations

Any contract awarded as a result of this ITB process may be terminated if sufficient appropriations or authorizations do not exist. Such terminations will be affected by sending written notice to the contractor. Ciudad SWCD's decision as to whether sufficient appropriations and authorizations are available will be accepted by the contractor as final.

9. Incurring Cost

Any cost incurred by the potential Bidder in preparation, transmittal, and/or presentation of any bid or material submitted in response to this ITB shall be borne solely by the Bidder. Any cost incurred by the Bidder for set up and demonstration of the proposed equipment and/or system shall be borne solely by the Bidder.

10. Prime Contractor Responsibility

Any contractual agreement that may result from this ITB shall specify that the prime contractor is solely responsible for fulfillment of all requirements of the contractual agreement with Ciudad SWCD which may derive from this ITB. Ciudad SWCD entering into a contractual agreement with a vendor will make payments to only the prime contractor.

11. Subcontractor Consent

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The use of subcontractors is allowed. The prime contractor shall be wholly responsible for the entire performance of the contractual agreement whether or not subcontractors are used. Additionally, the prime contractor must receive approval, in writing, from Ciudad SWCD awarding any resultant contract before any subcontractor is used during the term of this agreement.

12. Amended Bids

A Bidder may submit an amended bid before the deadline for receipt of bids. Such amended bids must be complete replacements for a previously submitted bid and must be clearly identified as such. Ciudad SWCD personnel will not merge, collate, or assemble bid materials.

13. Bidders Right to Withdraw Bid

Bidders will be allowed to withdraw their bids at any time prior to the deadline for receipt of bids. The Bidder must submit a written withdrawal request addressed to the Chief Procurement Officer and signed by the Bidders' duly authorized representative. The approval or denial of withdrawal requests received after the deadline for receipt of the proposals is governed by the applicable procurement regulations, 1.4.1.5 & 1.4.1.36 NMAC.

14. Disclosure of Bid Contents

The contents of all submitted bids will be kept confidential until the final award has been completed by Ciudad SWCD. At that time, all proposals and documents pertaining to the proposals will be available for public inspection, except, for confidential information. It is the Offeror's responsibility to submit a redacted copy (to black out, but not omit) of their proposal so that confidential information is not disclosed. Should the Offeror not submit a redacted copy, the proposal and all contents of the proposal will be made available for public inspection.

15. Payments for Purchases

Contracts resulting from this ITB shall contain a clause allowing for late payment charges against Ciudad SWCD in the amount and under the conditions set forth in Section 13-1-158 NMSA 1978.

16. Addenda

Each addendum shall be a part of the Contract Documents to the same extent as though contained in the original documents and itemized listings thereof and all Bidders shall be bound by such addenda. On their Bid, each Bidder shall acknowledge receipt of each addendum.

17. Statutory Preferences

Statutory preferences will be applied in determining low bidder. New Mexico law provides certain statutory preferences for several categories of bidders and offerors as well as for recycled content goods, pursuant to Sections 13-1-21 and 13-1-22 NMSA 1978. These preferences will be applied in regard to invitations for bids in accordance with the statute in determining the lowest bidder.

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18. Application of Preferences

Pursuant to the requirements set forth §13-4-2 NMSA 1978, preferences will be applied accordingly. State preferences shall be applied as in accordance with the following: Bidders must submit a valid preference certificate issued by the Taxation and Revenue Department. If the required preference certificate is submitted, the following preferences shall apply:

- Resident Contractor: bid shall be five percent lower than the bid actually received.
- Native American Resident Contractor: bid shall be eight percent lower than the bid actually received.
- Resident Veteran Contractor: bid shall be ten percent lower than the bid actually received.
- Bidders are not eligible to receive both a Resident Contractor preference and a Resident Veteran Contractor preference.

19. Specification and Fees

- a) Construction will be performed in conformance to the City of Albuquerque Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction, 1986 EDITION, including all updates. Copy is available on-line at //www.cabq.gov/planning/publications/standardspecs.html.
- b) Permits and Licenses: Unless otherwise specified herein, the Contractor is responsible to obtain and pay for all permits and licenses required for this Project. No Notice to Proceed (NTP) shall be issued until all fees for permits and licenses specified herein or required for the Project have been paid in full and proof thereof has been submitted to and approved by the Ciudad SWCD. This requirement includes, but is not limited to, all permits and fees required by Ciudad SWCD.

20. Interpretation of Documents

If any persons contemplating submitting a Bid for the Work are in doubt as to the meaning of any part of the Plans, Specifications or other Contract Documents, they may submit to Pland Collaborative a written request for an interpretation thereof at any time prior to close of business (5:00 pm local time) on Wednesday, March 20th, 2024 Any interpretation of the documents will be made only by addendum duly issued.

21. Examination of Specifications, Contract Documents, and Project Site

Each Bidder shall visit the site(s) of the proposed work, fully acquaint themselves with the existing conditions relating to the construction of the Project, fully inform themselves as to the facilities involved, and fully investigate the difficulties and restrictions attending the performance of the Contract. Each Bidder shall thoroughly examine and familiarize themselves with the Plans, Specifications, and all other Contract Documents. The Contractor, by the execution of the Contract, shall not be relieved of any obligations thereunder due to their failure to receive or examine any form or legal instrument or to visit the site(s) and acquaint themselves with the conditions there existing. Ciudad SWCD will be justified in

rejecting any claim based on facts which the Contractor should have noticed as a result of visiting the work site(s). NOTE: The location of all underground utilities is the responsibility of the Contractor. The Bidders shall familiarize themselves with federal, state and local laws, ordinances, rules and regulations and the Project site and local conditions and any other matters which would affect the construction and location of all underground utilities, performance of the Work and employment of labor thereon.

22. Approval of Insurance

If applicable, even though a "Notice to Proceed (NTP)" may have been given, the Contractor or a Subcontractor shall not begin any work under this Contract until the required insurance has been obtained and the proper Certificates (or insurance policies) have been filed with Ciudad SWCD, adding Ciudad SWCD as an additional insured as required by Ciudad SWCD. Neither approval nor failure to approve certificates, policies, or the insurance by Ciudad SWCD shall relieve the Contractor of full responsibility to maintain the required insurance in full force and effect.

23. Minimum Wage Rates

- a) The minimum wages to be paid to the various classes of mechanics and laborers engaged by the Contractor and Subcontractors for Work under this Contract including any additional, omitted or changed work, shall not be less than the amount as determined and established by the Labor and Industrial Division of the New Mexico Department of Workforce Solutions as provided by Section 13-4-11, N.M.S.A.1978 and in full force and effect, without exception, on the date of the Contract and during the lifetime of this Contract.
- b) The Contractor and each of its Subcontractors shall pay each of its employees working under this Contract in full, in cash, not less than once a week, less all legally required deductions or withholdings. When circumstances are such that payment in cash is not feasible or is impractical, payment may be made by check, provided, however, that adequate funds to cover same are on deposit at the bank upon which the checks are drawn, and further that the checks may be cashed without charge, trade requirements, or undue inconvenience to the payee.
- c) The minimum wage rates, if any, specified for apprentices shall apply only to persons working with the tools of the trade that they are learning, and under the direct supervision required by law, the number of apprentices in each trade or occupation employed by the Contractor or any Subcontractor shall not exceed the number permitted under the usual practice prevailing between Trade Unions and Employers Association of the respective trades or occupations.
- d) Extra Work Minimum Wage. In case Ciudad SWCD orders the Contractor to perform extra work or additional work which may make it necessary for the Contractor or any Subcontractor under him to employ, in the performance of such work, any person in any trade or occupation for which no minimum wage rate is specified, Ciudad SWCD will include in the Contract Change Order for such extra or additional work the minimum wage rate for such trade or

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> occupation, and insofar as such extra or additional work is concerned, there shall be paid each employee engaged in the work in such trade or occupation, not less than the minimum wage rate included.

- e) Wage Underpayments and Adjustments. The Contractor agrees that, in case of underpayment of wages to any worker on the Project under this Contract, Ciudad SWCD may withhold out of payments due, an amount sufficient to pay such worker the difference between the wages required to be paid under his Contract and the wages actually paid such worker for the total number of hours worked and that Ciudad SWCD may disburse such amount so withheld by it, for and on account of the Contractor to the employee to which such amount is due. The Contractor further agrees that the amounts to be withheld pursuant to this paragraph may be in addition to the percentages to be retained by Ciudad SWCD pursuant to other provisions of this Contract.
- A copy of the New Mexico State Office of the Labor Commissioner Minimum Wage Rates and Apprentices minimum wage scales in effect at the time of the Contract shall be posted or otherwise always made available to the Contractor's employees on the job.
- g) The Contractor and all Subcontractors shall, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by them or on their behalf, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, color, age, religion, gender, national origin, sexual orientation, spousal affiliation, veteran status, mental or physical disability, or handicap.
